EHS Technologies Corporation receives more than \$62.5 million in U.S. Navy contracts

MOORESTOWN, N.J. – March 6, 2008 – EHS Technologies has been awarded two contracts from the U.S. Navy Naval Surface Warfare Center’s (NSWC) Indian Head and Carderock Divisions valued at more than \$62.5 million for engineering and technical services. The contracts are the largest competitively bid awards the company has ever received. NSWC Indian Head is part of the Naval Sea Systems Command (NAVSEA) and is located in Indian Head, Md. NSWC Carderock is located in Bethesda, Md.

Under the terms of the \$30.8-million Indian Head contract, EHS Technologies will provide engineering, technical and program management services to support ordnance and related systems. Indian Head is the Department of Defense’s Energetics Systems Center. “Energetic systems” refers to explosives, propellants, pyrotechnics and their immediately related components. Complementing its energetic materials formulation work, NSWC Indian Head researches, develops, tests and engineers the range of technologies necessary to deliver ordnance to the military.

Under the terms of the \$31.8-million Carderock contract, the Moorestown company will provide engineering, technical analysis and support services in connection with ongoing tasks for naval ship Hull, Mechanical and Electrical (HM&E) combat support to the NSWC Carderock Division’s Ship Systems Engineering Station at the Philadelphia Naval Business Center.
